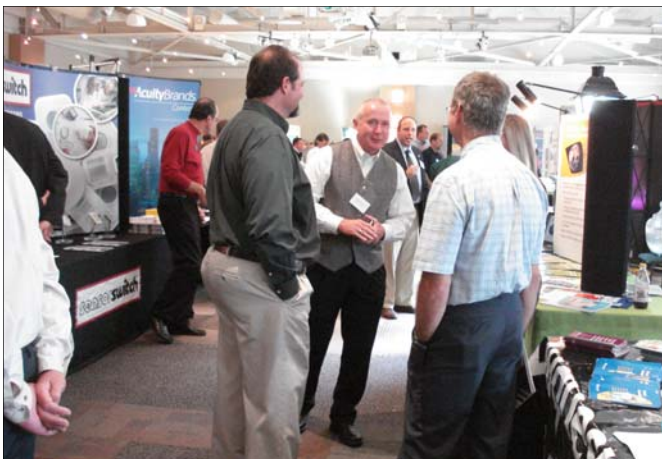
Phase and The Hite Company.
